

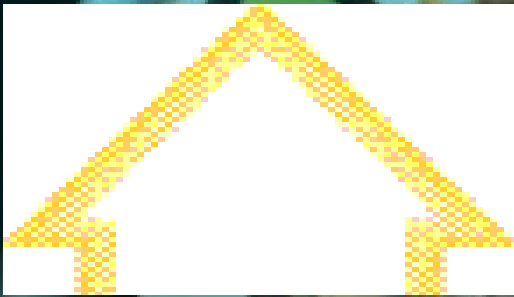

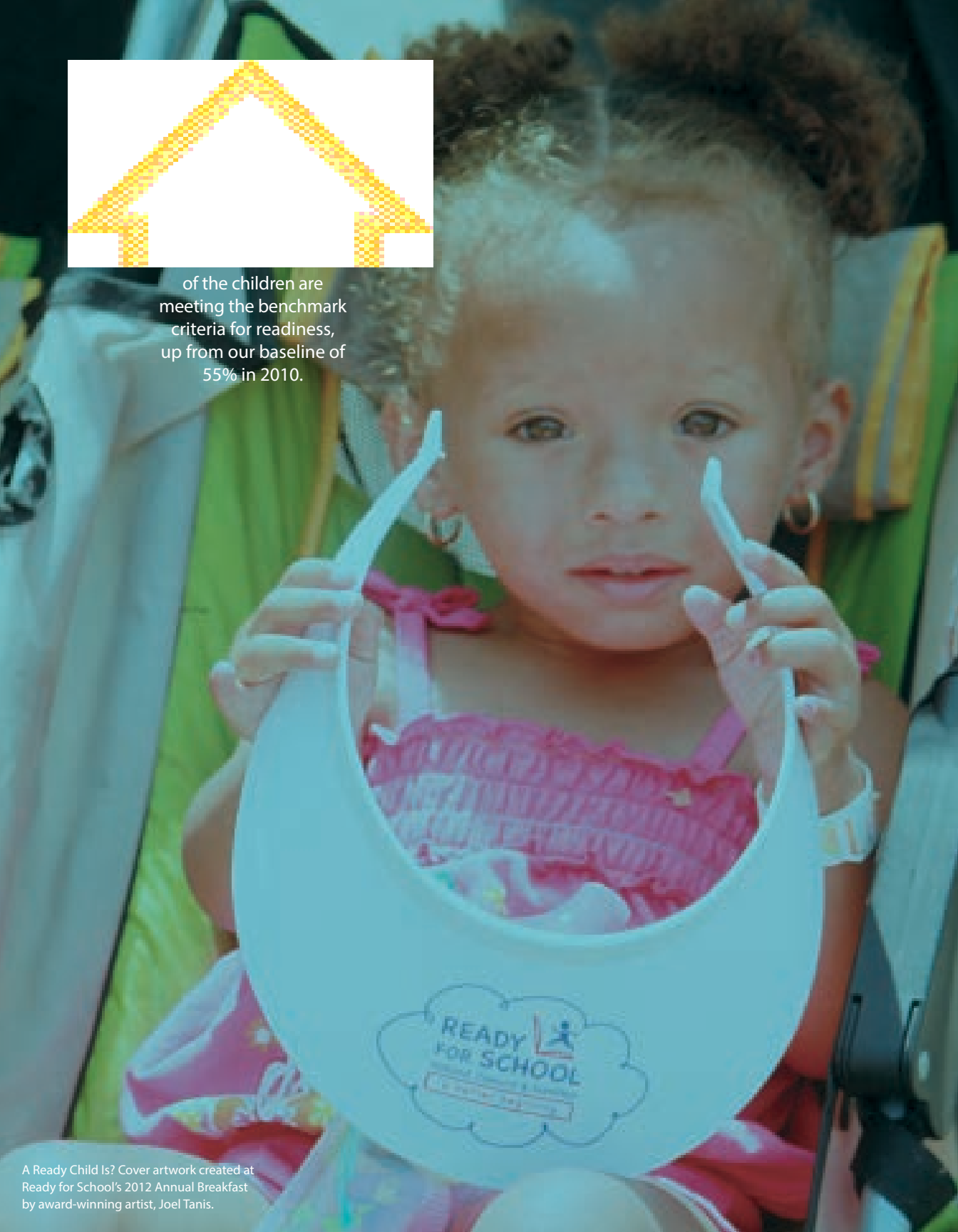

HEALTH INITIATIVES

Parents, especially expectant and new mothers, view their physicians as trusted sources for developmental information. Parents are encouraged to have their infants and toddlers (ages 0–5) attend 12 well-child visits with their doctors. Ready for School is dedicated to strengthening the relationship between parents and their child’s doctor, helping them provide a healthy beginning by becoming partners in their child’s overall success.

REACH OUT AND READ LAKESHORE INITIATIVE

In fall of 2012, Ready for School launched the Reach Out and Read Lakeshore Initiative with the goal of having all children ages 0–5 years connect regularly with their health care provider on literacy, as well as health. This will initially be achieved by prescribing and providing a free, developmentally appropriate book at each well-child exam in the provider’s office. Using the existing well-established and trusted Reach Out and Read program, we have coalesced with physicians to navigate the program’s guidelines and expectations. By the close of 2013, we anticipate all physician offices serving children ages 0–5 years in our community will have an active Reach Out and Read Program. Kudos to our community!



Of all referrals to Ready for School’s Healthy Beginnings program, 27% were due to speech delays. In 2012, we developed and secured the funding for Ready Set Talk, a speech therapy program for preschool aged children to be piloted in 2013.



In 2012, Ready for School followed the experiences of four teen mothers who we connected with community resources, documenting the obstacles they encountered and the gaps in services they identified.

ELI'S STORY

Growing up, I never knew the importance of reading to your kids at a very young age. When I first had my son in 2006, it never crossed my mind to teach him letters, numbers, and colors because I thought that was for the school teachers. Bringing him to the Holland Community Health Center was a very good thing because here they taught us to read to him and teach him at home. That would prove to be very helpful, because today he is a very bright student. A 1st-grader and top of his class, he is always getting compliments on how smart he is. We never thought that reading to him at such a young age would have this much of an impact on his academics. We are extremely grateful for the Reach Out and Read program in his physicians' office, and will continue to use this method at home with our future children.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

If we are to truly make a difference in the futures of our children, we must first engage the parents. In 2012, Ready for School staff and volunteers participated and/or hosted 69 community, employer, neighborhood or church events to connect with parents.

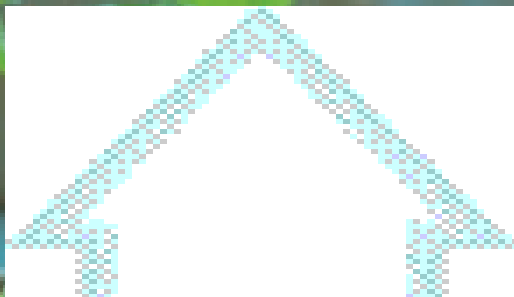
EMPLOYER OF YEAR AWARDS

At our annual breakfast each December, we recognize two "Employers of the Year" that exemplify how an employer can advance the work and awareness of Ready for School by promoting early education to their employees and connecting new parents to information. In 2012, Gentex and Plascore were the recipients of the award. Both were recognized for their efforts in adopting local preschools.



We recruited four parent ambassadors – bilingual parents who reside within opportunity zones – who share in our mission and serve as connectors in the neighborhoods to bring parents together.

Ready for School rented an ice cream truck and drove through neighborhoods, providing ice cream and books to children while connecting with their parents on resources and education.



Awareness of the Ready for School brand by parents of incoming kindergartners has increased from 35% in 2011 to 49% in 2012.

EDUCATION INITIATIVES

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Each month, Ready for School gathers preschool center directors and in-home childcare providers for roundtable discussions to network, share ideas and identify obstacles or areas where support is needed for them to provide the very best quality care.

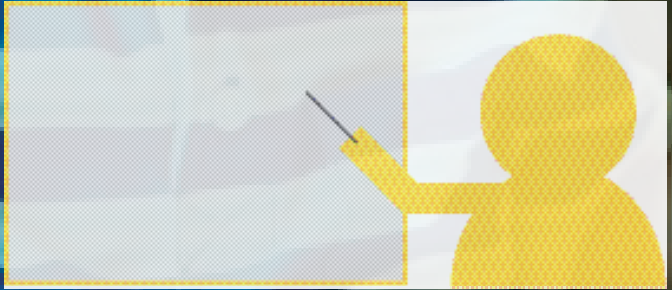

KINDER CAMP

This three-day kindergarten orientation was attended by 625 children (up from 90 in 2011), in 46 classrooms in 16 schools.

HOME BEFORE SCHOOL

In 2012, Ready for School kicked off Home Before School, a series of free parent training events offered in the evening and open to all parents of children ages 0–5 years. These events offer parents information, strategies and materials to assist them in engaging with their children.

READY SET SCHOOL

Some families are in need of one-on-one intervention. Soon, Ready for School will pilot Ready Set School. Developed by a team of early education specialists, this new parent curriculum was designed to train volunteers to be partners with parents, helping them become the very best teachers to their child.

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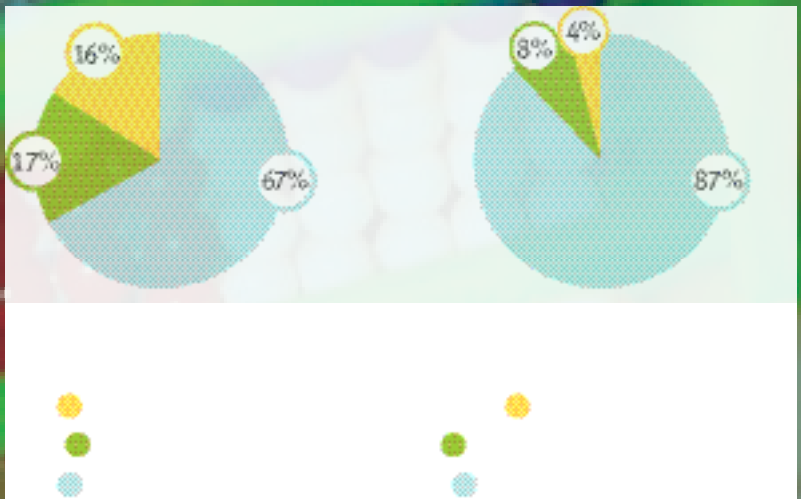
