# 2019 KINDERGARTEN READINESS PROGRESS REPORT

#### POTENTIAL IS EQUALLY DISTRIBUTED ACROSS A POPULATION. **OPPORTUNITY IS NOT.** READY FOR SCHOOL PROVDES COMMUNITIES WITH A BLUEPRINT TO POTENTIAL INCREASING KINDERGARTEN READINESS FROM 43% IN 2009 TO 70% IN 2019.

In the last decade, we've learned there isn't one intervention or a single solution to a complex social issue. But we know what progress looks like: Building equity through preschool scholarships during the traditional school year, a summer kindergarten readiness camp, professional development of early childhood educators, and providing pediatric medical providers with a tool for increasing literacy and connections are examples of what it is making the difference for children and families in our communities.

Rast fall the class of 2033 started school prepared to succeed because of this community's decision to invest in them before they were even born. In 2019, 70% of our incoming Kindergarten students met the benchmark criteria for readiness - up from 43% in 2009. The change in trajectory from 2009 equates to 4,000 more children equipped to realize their full potential. It didn't happen by accident.

Strategies outlined in this report were devised in 2017 guided by local data revealing trends, gaps, and greatest need for our intervention. The story in 2019 is that informed action delivers readiness gains. We celebrate 70% Knowing the hard work there is ahead of us to reach the next 30%.

Kong term success requires alignment between municipalities, education, healthcare, and business to build child ingrastructure. Ready for School calls it KADgrastructure.
